II. Procedure

A. Crisis Intervention Team

1. Direct intervention in crisis situations is the responsibility of professionals in the school system. Students, parents, and other lay persons may serve in advisory capacities. The county team and the school committee can draw upon existing student and lay organizations such as Student Councils, CAC, PTA, and other related school organizations.
2. Upon consultation with the school principal and the appropriate director, the Superintendent or his designee shall decide whether the Crisis Intervention Team will be activated.

B. Composition of the Team:

1. Deputy Superintendent;
2. Director of Pupil Services;
3. Coordinator of Pupil Personnel;
4. Selected Pupil Personnel Worker;
5. Administrative Assistant to the Superintendent; and
6. Other personnel as required.

C. Functions of the Team:

1. assists the school staff in the restoration of order and the resumption of normal school routine;
 2. assists the school in planning to resolve the immediate crisis;
