- I. The raising and expending of funds by schools, student organizations, and parent groups will have the basic purpose of promoting the general welfare, education, morale, and civic responsibility of students and of contributing to the support of the extracurricular activities of the school.
  - II. Projects for the raising of funds should contribute to the educational experience of students and may not conflict with or disrupt the operation of the instructional program.
  - III. Expenditures may be made to augment school activities or programs. Expenditures are not to replace programs provided by the Board.
  - IV. The local participation of the school in fund raising projects, whether conducted by the total school or by student organizations, will be governed by the following considerations:
    - A. The fund raising projects will be planned in advance, and the number will be kept to a minimum, as determined by the principal to meet the needs of the school.
    - B. All fund raising projects will be approved by the principal. Three areas to be considered in the decision-making process are educational values for students, benefits for students, and the safety of students.
    - C. Students will participate in fund raising activities on a voluntary basis. If the activities of the organization depend upon fund raising by all the students in the organization, all these students will be informed of the expectation to complete the fund raising project in order to participate in the activity. An exception would be extenuating circumstances in the case of individual student(s), as determined by the advisor and the principal.
    - D. There will be no exploitation of students in fund raisers.
    - E. Only school-sponsored fund raisers will be allowed, and each fund raiser will be clearly identified as to sponsorship.

- F. The school community will be made aware of school-wide fund raising projects.
- G. All students participating in fund raising activities will be provided identification indicating sponsorship.
- H. The projects will not engage school staff in additional work to the extent that the fund raisers become detrimental to the educational program.
- I. The request of a charitable organization for the participation of schools and/or school organizations in fund raising drives will be denied. However, if a school organization initiates a request to support a charitable organization or cause, the principal will make the final decision as to approval.
