As I reflect on the school year as it draws to a close, I want to share some of my thoughts with you. I also want to take this opportunity to express my sincerest appreciation to our entire community for their continued support and cooperation. Our many parent organizations offer great opportunities to all students and promote our every endeavor. Additionally, I am appreciative of the business partnerships we have developed and for their sustained collaboration. With every change and challenge, our community rallies and advocates on behalf of our students.

This year has brought about several accomplishments. Ms. Heather Hoffman, English Department, was selected to represent GBHS as teacher of the year, and Ms. Megan Lazor, World and Classical Languages Department, represented us at the North Anne Arundel County Chamber of Commerce Teacher Awards dinner held at Michaels Fifth Avenue. Congratulations to both as well as all Glen Burnie teachers who continue to do an outstanding job working with our students. We also introduced three new athletic programs, Bocci Ball, Modified Tennis, and Bowling into our curriculum. Currently, we are in the process of having the heating and air conditioning systems replaced in four of our buildings which will take place this summer.

To date, the class of 2011 has been awarded over \$1 million and still climbing. **Parents are invited to our Senior Awards Program on May 25th at 6:30 p.m. in our auditorium.** Our AP courses continue to grow. AP testing enrollment increased 18% in the number of students actually testing, and 27% more tests were given compared to last year. These are just a sampling of Glen Burnie High School's efforts to increase standards for excellence by providing rigorous academic programs for all.

Please remind your student to take every advantage of the many academic support clinics we offer in order to maintain academic success, especially as they prepare for finals. Our Wednesday activity buses will continue to accommodate those students who stay after for remediation or enrichment. Should you have any concerns, please contact your student's teachers or guidance counselor.

Keep on encouraging your child to be respectful of themselves, others, and school property. They are obligated to follow all school rules and policies. 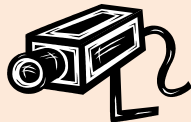
PERSONAL PROPERTY

VIDEO CAMERA SYSTEM



Glen Burnie High School is equipped with a video camera system. It covers selected interior and exterior public portions of the building and grounds. It is NOT monitored constantly, but it is monitored during emergency situations. During certain events, when the safety or security of students may be in question, authorized personnel from local, state, or federal police or fire emergency units may be given access to view images projected on the camera system. **SCHOOL SYSTEM OFFICES SHIFTING TO
FOUR-DAY WORK WEEK FOR
SEVEN WEEKS THIS SUMMER**

Schools Superintendent Dr. Kevin M. Maxwell announced on March 9th that county schools and school system offices will operate on a four-day work week for seven weeks this summer, saving approximately \$215,000 in operating and transportation costs without any decrease in productivity.

Glen Burnie High School will be open Monday through Thursday beginning June 22, 2011 through Tuesday, August 9, 2011. **All AACPS schools and offices will be close on Friday during the modified schedule period which runs from June 22, 2011 through August 9, 2011.** If your child is enrolled in a program that is scheduled to use our school during this period, please check with the sponsoring agency to make sure you know the correct schedule.

BOARD APPROVES 10-CENT INCREASE IN SCHOOL BREAKFAST, LUNCH PRICES FOR 2011-2012 SCHOOL YEAR

To accommodate rising costs, school breakfast and lunch prices will cost 10 cents more next year under a plan approved by the Board of Education. At its May 4 meeting, the Board approved changes that will boost the cost of full-price breakfast for all students to \$1.35, lunch for elementary students to \$2.60, and lunch for secondary students to \$2.85.

Milk prices will remain at 55 cents, and the cost of reduced-price meals for students who qualify also will remain unchanged.

About 55 percent of the Anne Arundel County Public Schools Food and Nutrition Services budget is derived from food sales at schools. Approximately 43 percent comes from restricted federal funding and the remaining 2 percent comes through state funding.

AACPS' Division of Food and Nutrition Services serves more than 1.6 million breakfasts and 4.6 million lunches each school year. It also serves more than 56,000 pounds of local produce annually, offers monthly "Tasting of the Rainbow" events to entice students to try new fruits and vegetables, and provides nearly 96,000 snacks to students during MSA testing.
