MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

We trust that you have had a restful and gratifying summer vacation. During this summer we have been working diligently to prepare for the 2008-2009 school year. This summer we were fortunate to host the Maryland State Department of Education's Summer Chinese Camp for students in grades 4-6. For the first time we sponsored a summer Gateway to Technology program for students grades 6-8. The purpose of the program is to expose students to math and science related activities with the intent to peak an interest in pre-engineering activities associated with our Gateway to Technology program. This school year, we will keep you informed of our progress by sending home a monthly newsletter. The monthly newsletter will also be posted on our school's website.

It is our expectation that all students will purchase a Student Agenda book (\$5.00) in order to keep track of homework, upcoming assessments and projects. Please work with us to ensure your child is completing his/her assignments by regularly monitoring their Student Agenda book.

What to do the first day of school?

Upon entering the building, you should report directly to your assigned "temporary" homeroom. You will receive your schedule of classes during homeroom. The first day of school will be a day of orientation. You will be given a tour of the building; you will meet your teachers and other staff members; you will be introduced to the courses that you are taking; you will be assigned a locker; and you will eat lunch. Homeroom assignments and a map of the school are included in this newsletter. It is important for you to watch your local newspaper for specific bus information because some of the stops may be different this year. You can also go online at www.aacps.org for bus information. During the first week of school, students should arrive at bus stop earlier than the pick-up time. After a few days, the bus routes will be established and you should arrive no sooner than ten minutes prior to the scheduled pick-up time.

STUDENT ATTENDANCE

We firmly believe that regular attendance in school is necessary for a student to benefit from our instructional program. Students absent from school should always return with a note from parents/guardians explaining the absence. Please include in all absence notes:

1. The date(s) absent (month, day)
2. Reason for absence
3. The student's full name
4. Your signature and a telephone number where you can be reached during the school day.

EARLY DISMISSAL

PARENTS: If you know in advance that you will be picking up your child for an early dismissal, please send a note in with your child stating the reason for dismissal. Please tell your child to report to the main office first thing in the morning. He/she will be given a pass to leave their class at the appropriate time. Your child will wait for you in the main office when you arrive to sign them out. This prevents interruption of the classroom and saves you time.

NOTICE – SCHOOL BUS BEHAVIOR RULES ARE IN EFFECT STARTING THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL

School bus transportation is a privilege. This privilege may be temporarily denied or permanently revoked if a student's misconduct jeopardizes the safe operation of the school bus or the safety of pupils riding the bus. Parents are responsible to see that their child attends school despite loss of riding privilege.

Once the child enters the school bus, the authority to manage student's conduct lies with the bus driver and the school administration.

Conduct Standard

Behavior or activity jeopardizing the safe operation of the school bus or interfering with the welfare of other vehicle occupants is prohibited. The use of tobacco and tobacco products are prohibited on all school buses.

Sanctions for Misconduct

- A. For the first offense, the administrative staff will take appropriate action, which will include but is not limited to a parent conference. In addition, appropriate action for a first offense may include bus or school suspensions; the first offense may include bus or school suspensions;

the term will be determined by the school administrator.

- B. For a second, third, or fourth offense and after parent notification, the administrative staff will take appropriate action which will include but is not limited to:
1. bus suspension for up to five days for a second offense;
 2. bus suspension from six to ten days for a third offense;
 3. bus suspension for the balance of the school year for a fourth offense.
- C. Without limiting other available actions or remedies, the school administrative staff is authorized to secure restitution for vandalism caused by students to school buses.

Smoking violations will result in mandatory attendance at the school systems Anti-Tobacco Use Program, suspension, or expulsion from school in accordance with school system policy.

MEADE MIDDLE SCHOOL INTERDISCIPLINARY TEAMS

Meade Middle School has five interdisciplinary teams. The interdisciplinary team includes a student's major academic and special area teachers. This group of teachers is responsible for the educational progress of a group of students. This team of teachers may plan the instructional day, coordinate activities, conference with parents, and deliver additional advisory support to students. This approach promotes a sense of community within students and permits individualized attention for students. Further, this approach over the years has been extremely successful for our students.

Educators have learned that the interdisciplinary team structure is far more than a way to encourage team teaching. It is a method of bringing teachers and students together to establish personalized learning communities. When teachers and students are grouped together into interdisciplinary teams, it creates a common

link that holds together almost every other aspect of the school program.

The interdisciplinary team uses common planning time to plan, implement, and evaluate a program of instruction for their students. The interdisciplinary team (IDT) helps students to see relationships in content and skills learned in school subjects. The IDT encourages an emphasis on the student, as well as the subject matter, by providing on-going assessment of student needs, a coordination of teaching efforts, and more personalized instruction.

There is little doubt that the interdisciplinary team organization provides a smooth and supportive transition for students moving from the largely self-contained atmosphere of the elementary school to the more loosely organized, but highly departmentalized situation of the average high school.

The IDT should also manage instructional workload demands by coordinating the amount of homework and scheduling of tests and major projects' due dates.

Finally, IDTs can design a variety of instructional activities, which address the developmental characteristics of middle school students. Instructional activities, which should be coordinated by the team, may include projects, field trips, career exploration,

community service, and skill development programs.

CONNECT-ED PHONE MESSAGE SYSTEM INCREASES HOME-SCHOOL COMMUNICATION

Anne Arundel County Public Schools just completed its first full school year utilizing an automated telephone notification system called Connect-ED. The system, designed to increase communication between schools and parents, was a resounding success.

Over the course of the 2007-2008 school year, Connect-ED was used to send more than 16,000 messages to parents. Of those, 15,184 were attendance notification calls to households of absent students. Of the 862 calls with systemwide or school-specific messages, more than 85 percent were successful in reaching their designated contacts. The system has quickly become a primary source of information between schools and homes of students, and schools are being encouraged to utilize it even more effectively in the coming school year.

Guidelines have been put in place to ensure parents are not overwhelmed with calls. The school system's Public Information Office will send out school delays and closings as well as some emergency messages (typically sent when parents are at work) when warranted. Individual schools

will most often send out "community outreach" messages to inform parents about upcoming special events. Messages will be delivered by e-mail when parents provide e-mail addresses to their child's school.

One note about calls concerning weather-related closings and delayed openings: Such calls must be sent out early in the morning in order to reach the students who will be at bus stops earliest. Typically, such calls will be sent out at about 5:40 a.m. If you do not wish for these calls to go to your home phone (and would prefer for them to go to a cell phone, for instance), simply contact our school and ask that the primary number designation be changed. However, please be aware that this changes the primary number designation for all calls.

Connect-ED numbers are pulled from the student database, which contains phone numbers and e-mail addresses for all students. It is critical that you keep our school updated with the correct phone numbers and e-mail addresses so that we can configure Connect-ED to reach you quickly when needed. Connect-ED will call up to two numbers and send up to two e-mails for community outreach messages, and can call up to six numbers and send up to two e-mails for emergency messages. Attendance notification messages will be sent to the student's primary

phone number, which is usually – but does not have to be – the home number, and up to two e-mail addresses.

The student emergency card has been reconfigured to allow spaces for all of these phone numbers and e-mail addresses. When you fill it out, please make sure to write the numbers clearly so they can be properly entered in our database. Changes in any numbers, whether they are the primary contact number or some backup number, should be reported to the school as soon as possible.

One other note: If you have more than one child in the same school, don't worry. Connect-ED only sends one call per number so you won't receive multiple calls with the same message. The exception to this is attendance notification messages, which will be delivered for every child who is absent.

HOMEWORK HINTS

1. Check to see that your children understand their assignments. If there is a problem, work through an example with them.
2. Sign and date your children's homework. Teachers appreciate it when they know that the parents are interested enough to check over their children's homework and see that it is finished.
3. Follow-up on homework assignments by asking to see your children's homework, after it has been seen by the teacher. Look at the teacher's comments to see if your children have done the assignments correctly.
4. Contact the teacher if you don't understand the assignments or your child has a special problem. This is a common problem among parents, so don't hesitate to contact the teacher.
5. Look for homework daily. Assume that your children have homework to do every day.

6. Resist doing your children's homework for them. Work with them and encourage them to do the work themselves.
7. Be sure to praise your children for a job well done. Encourage the good work that your children do and comment about improvements they have made.

Mandatory School Uniform Policy 2008-2009
(This policy is the same as the 2007-2008 school year)

Things listed below are in **COMPLIANCE** with the mandatory uniform policy. Adhering to this policy will help

Things listed below are **VIOLATIONS** of the uniform policy. The policy is for girls and boys.

make your time at Meade Middle School pleasant and enjoyable. The policy is for boys and girls.

- **TOPS:** Tops must be light blue, white, or black long or short-sleeved polo style with two or three clear, black or appropriate colored buttons at the neck. Tops must be tucked in securely.
- **OTHER TOPS:** Other tops may include a v-neck sweater style vest, front button cardigan, sweatshirt with a banded collar or a Meade Middle School sweatshirt. Tops must be light blue, white, or black.
- **BELTS:** A solid, plain black, dark brown, or navy blue leather or leather-like belt must go through the loops and be buckled securely around your waist. Belt buckles should be plain.
- **SHOES:** Shoes must be safe and enclose the foot. Shoes may not expose students to safety hazards nor should they impede a student from moving quickly during an evacuation of the building. Athletic shoes are permitted.
- **PANTS:** Navy blue, black, or Khaki full-length standard issue pants are to be worn securely around your waist with a belt.
- **SKIRTS/SHORTS/SKORTS:** Navy blue, black, or khaki; must be longer than fingertips when standing at attention. (Shorts may be worn between April 1 until Oct. 31.)
- **JEWELRY AND ACCESSORIES:** Necklaces, bracelets, rings, and earrings are permitted as accessories.
- **TOPS:** Tops may not have any designs, logos, characters, names or numbers of any size. Sleeveless tops, crop tops, v-necks, halters, undershirts, and tee shirts are not allowed. Tops may not be un-tucked. (White T-shirts may be worn under the school uniform top.)
- **OTHER TOPS:** Tops may not have a hood, zipper, designs, logos, characters, names or numbers of any size. Jackets and coats may not be worn in class and must be kept in your locker.
- **BELTS:** Belts may not have anything dangling. They may not contain chain loops, symbols, large designer insignia, characters, names or numbers of any size.
- **SHOES:** FLIP-FLOPS OR SANDALS MAY NOT BE WORN TO SCHOOL.
- **PANTS:** Pants may not contain large designer insignia, characters, names or numbers. Rubber bands and bandanas are not allowed on any part of your pants. Pants may not be rolled up or tucked into shoes or boots.
- **SKIRTS/SHORTS/SKORTS:** Mini and/or tight skirts/shorts/skort are not allowed.
- **JEWELRY AND ACCESSORIES:** Jewelry should not pose safety hazards or be a distraction. Necklaces should not be longer than 18 inches. Charms may not be replicas of weapons or contraband. Bandanas are not permitted.

Escuela secundaria Meade

Política de uniforme obligatorio

Las prendas indicadas a continuación **CUMPLEN** con la política de uniforme obligatorio. El cumplimiento de esta política ayudará a que el tiempo que estén en la Escuela secundaria Meade sea placentero y agradable. La política es para niños y niñas.

- **CAMISAS/BLUSAS:** Las camisetas/blusas deben ser celestes, blancas o negras, de manga larga o corta, tipo polo, con dos o tres botones transparentes, negros o de color apropiado en el cuello. Las camisetas deben estar bien metidas en el pantalón.
- **OTRAS PRENDAS SUPERIORES:** Las otras prendas superiores pueden incluir un suéter con escote en V, estilo chaleco, cárdigan con botones al frente, sudadero con franjas en el cuello o un sudadero de la Escuela secundaria Meade. Las prendas superiores deben ser celestes, blancas o negras.
- **CINCHOS:** Un cincho de cuero o imitación de cuero negro, café oscuro o azul marino liso debe ir en las jaretas y estar firmemente abrochado alrededor de su cintura. Las hebillas del cincho deberán ser lisas.
- **ZAPATOS:** Los zapatos deben ser seguros y cerrados. Los zapatos no pueden poner en peligro a los estudiantes ni deberán impedir que el estudiante se mueva rápidamente durante una evacuación del edificio. Se permiten zapatos atléticos.
- **PANTALONES:** Deben usarse pantalones largos, estilo estándar, azul marino, negros o caqui, asegurados alrededor de la cintura con un cincho.
- **FALDAS/PANTALONES CORTOS/FALDAS PANTALÓN:** Azul marino, negros o caqui; deben ser más largas que la altura a donde llegan las puntas de los dedos al pararse recto/a. (Las pantalones cortos se pueden llevar del 1 de abril al 31 de octubre.)
- **JOYAS Y ACCESORIOS:** Se permiten collares, pulseras, anillos y aretes como accesorios.

Las prendas que se indican a continuación son **INFRACCIONES** de la política de uniforme. La política es para niños y niñas.

- **CAMISAS/BLUSAS:** Las camisetas/blusas no pueden tener diseños, logotipos, caracteres, nombres o números de cualquier tamaño. No se permiten camisetas sin mangas, camisetas cortas, con escote en V, blusas sin espalda, camisetas y playeras. Las camisetas no pueden estar de fuera. (Se pueden usar playeras blancas debajo de la camiseta/blusa del uniforme de la escuela.)
- **OTRAS PRENDAS SUPERIORES:** Las camisetas/blusas no pueden tener capucha, zíper, diseños, logotipos, caracteres, nombres o números de cualquier tamaño. No se pueden usar chaquetas ni sacos en clase y se deben guardar en su casillero.
- **CINCHOS:** Los cinchos no pueden tener nada colgando. No pueden tener adornos de cadenas, símbolos, insignias grandes de diseñadores, caracteres, nombres o números de cualquier tamaño.
- **ZAPATOS:** NO SE PUEDEN USAR SANDALIAS EN LA ESCUELA.
- **PANTALONES:** Los pantalones no pueden tener insignias grandes de diseñadores, caracteres, nombres o números. No se permiten cintas elásticas ni pañuelos en cualquier parte de sus pantalones. Los pantalones no pueden estar enrollados o metidos entre los zapatos o botas.
- **FALDAS/PANTALONES CORTOS/FALDAS PANTALÓN:** No se permite usar faldas/pantalones cortos/faldas pantalón que sean muy cortos o ajustados.
- **JOYAS Y ACCESORIOS:** Las joyas no deberán ser peligrosas o ser una distracción. Los collares no deberán tener más de 18 pulgadas de largo. Los dijes no pueden ser réplicas de armas o contrabando.
