SPHS Signature begins partnership with AACC offering the Business Transfer Pathway

Signature students are excited to start the first inaugural class of the Business Transfer Pathway this Spring. The pathway is a joint partnership with Anne Arundel Community College and SPHS's Business, Innovation & Leadership Signature Program that offers Students a steppingstone to a business or entrepreneurship degree. Beginning junior year, students may enroll in the program and earn 6 college credits. These include: "Introduction to Entrepreneurship" (ESI-103) & "Introduction to Business" (BPA-111) - taught on-location at SPHS. During senior year, Pathway to Business students may take 12 credits (four courses) at Anne Arundel Community College at the Arnold campus during the school day. After high school graduation, students can either attend AACC and complete an associate degree in business or entrepreneurship in approximately three full-time terms or request to transfer these courses to a four-year university. Many of these courses are required by Maryland public universities for a bachelor's degree in business. The 50% reduction in tuition (ECAP) rate is available to all students taking college classes while still enrolled in high school. Additional funding may be available through the Early College Access Grant (ECAG) program.
