Welcome to EXPLORE

The Gifted/Talented/Advanced Programs Office of Anne Arundel County Public Schools and AACC sponsor the **EXPLORE** program for elementary school students presently in grades K through five.

We offer courses year-round. **EXPLORE** classes nurture students' potential. Classes encourage students to explore their interests and discover hidden talents and abilities.

EXPLORE topics extend learning that occurs through the standard school curricula as well as outside the curricula. Our instruction stimulates students' thinking and creativity, offers opportunities for them to develop the reasoning process and interact with each other.

Who Should Attend

Anne Arundel County Public Schools nominate public school students for participation. A child is selected based on the following potential ability indicators. **THE GRADES REFER TO GRADES COMPLETED.**

Grades K-3

- Expresses creative and imaginative ideas
- Demonstrates the ability to communicate to others
- Organizes ideas and makes relationships to more than one area
- Spends extra time on projects of interest
- Wants to know causes and reasons for things
- Reasons things out in a clear and logical manner
- Produces many ideas in the process of role playing and storytelling
- Communicates skillfully through visual media
- Interprets songs, poems and stories through creative movement and dance
- Speaks vividly in a lively, intense, penetrating, exciting manner using analogies and metaphors
- Arranges blocks and other play materials in many combinations
- Conceptualizes problems in terms of concrete objects and systems
- Does not give up easily; keeps trying to solve problems
- Sees relevance of new information
- Produces work that is above average when compared to age peers

Grades 4-6

- Shows a need to know
- Looks for similarities and differences in events, people and things
- Strives toward perfection; is self-critical
- Offers unusual, unique, clever responses to problem situations
- Feels comfortable with situations which may not have right or wrong answers
- Produces work that is above average in quality regardless of the amount generated
- Is not easily discouraged
- Comprehends and organizes ideas
- Recalls and uses information
- Communicates ideas clearly

Course Information — The date, place, time and cost of each course are listed after the course description. The price stated at the end of each course description is the total cost including tuition and supplies fees. Disciplinary Problems — Any student requested to leave a class because of disruptive behavior must do so and, if necessary, will be dropped from the class. No refunds will be given in these cases.

Finding Your Class — For a class at AACC, call the recording at **410-777-2241** or the office at **410-777-2325** the day before the course begins. Directions to other sites are in this brochure. Parents may find their child's class location by going to www.aacc.edu and insert the course number in the space on the upper right hand corner that says course search.

Transportation — Parents are responsible for transporting children to and from class.

Parent Consent Forms — Parent consent forms will be completed the first day of camp. If your child is signed up for more than one camp, please ask the instructor for the consent form at the final class so you may use it at the next camp. If you are not bringing your child to the first day of camp please e-mail us your name and address so we can mail you the forms prior to the beginning of camp at kic@aacc.edu. This must be done by June 1. After that date, please come to Johnson 212 for the necessary forms.

Enrollment Confirmation — You will **ONLY** be contacted if (a) the course is canceled, (b) there is a change in the schedule or (c) space is not available because the course is full. Parents may view their schedule by going to myaacc.aacc.edu.

Money Matters

Class Cancellations — When a course is canceled, AACC makes every effort to notify all registered students promptly. Full refunds are automatically processed.

Late Pick-up Fee — You are responsible for picking up your child on time. If you are late picking up your child at any location, you will be charged a \$20 fee for each 15 minutes.

Returned Check Fee — A \$25 processing fee is charged for a returned check.

From BALTIMORE: From Interstate 695 take exit 2, Route 10 toward Severna Park. Stay on Route 10 until it ends at Route 2. Follow Route 2 south approximately five miles. Turn left at College Parkway. The first right turn is the campus entrance.
