Early Access Programs

Anne Arundel County Public Schools (AACPS) and Anne Arundel Community College (AACC) provide Early Access programs, including **Jump Start** and **Dual Credit**, for qualifying high school seniors who wish to benefit from experience on a college campus. Students will have the opportunity to participate in a variety of course delivery options including during the day, evening, online, hybrid, and weekends.

• Jump Start

Students enroll in courses and receive *college credit only* for these courses.

• Dual Credit

Students earn both *high school and college credit for approved courses* which are either *not available at their current high school* or for which *they do not have access*. Students receiving an AACC grade of 'A,' 'B,' 'C,' or 'D' will receive an AACPS grade of 'S.' An AACC grade of 'F,' 'FX,' or 'I' will be equivalent to an AACPS grade of 'U.' **AACC courses do not calculate towards a students AACPS GPA.**

Student Requirements

Students requesting enrollment in the **Jump Start** and/or **Dual Credit** programs must meet the following criteria:

- Complete the application neatly & accurately
- Be enrolled in a *minimum* of two half-credit classes each semester at the high school
- Have senior status (have earned a minimum of 20 credits) and be in good standing
- Be at least 16 years old
- Maintain a minimum 2.0 cumulative grade-point average
- Are able to provide their own transportation
- Meet requirements for admission by completing the appropriate application, course prerequisites and meeting AACC testing requirements

The cost to attend AACC is the responsibility of the student/parent.
