She has traveled to Accra Ghana, West Africa where she was invited to return the next year to teach for eight weeks. When she returned in 1997, she along with her daughter took over 3500 books and school supplies for the school and was able to opened one of the first library in a public school in Accra Ghana.

In 2007, Ms. Davenport was able to help three students to received more than twenty thousand dollars in scholarship money to attend college.
