Mr. Greene is a Partner with the law firm of Patton Boggs LLP. In 2004, he was awarded The 2004 Nguyen Thi and Vu Thik Kim Dung Human Rights Award for outstanding public service to human trafficking victims throughout the United States, through advocacy for and speedy passage in Congress of the Trafficking Victims Protection Reauthorization Act of 2003. Mr. Greene's other professional experience includes serving as Chairman of a privately- held holding company involved in the retail foodservice industry and as a former President of commercial building services contracting company.

Locally, Mr. Greene is active in his community having served on boards and civic associations. Mr. Greene also serves as a member of the Maryland Business Roundtables' Achievement Counts program in Anne Arundel County in which business professionals mentor and encourage junior high school students to strive for excellence.
