AACPS NBCT Current and Upcoming Happenings

- · Monthly Meetings for initial and continuing candidates
- Maintenance of Certification (MOC) Candidates Monthly Meeting
 - Each candidate is assigned to a Professional Learning Facilitator (Mentor) in their certification area. Currently we have 55 Mentors supporting over 325 candidates
- 15 school based support groups led by NBCT's at their schools
- Saturday Blitzes monthly work time from 9-2 with NBCT Teacher Specialists and NBCT's providing support
- Recruitment through AAASBE Meetings
- Working with the Workforce Specialist to recruit diverse candidates
- Visiting MSDE identified schools to provide information about National Board Certification
- Monthly virtual informational meetings
- Hosted Jumpstart Sessions to help prepare candidates for the certification process
- Created a NBCT Leadership Team to address recruiting diverse candidates
- Hosting a Diverse Candidate Networking session in November

Employee Retention Initiatives

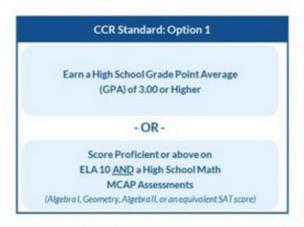

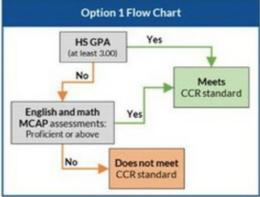
Pillar 3: College and Career Readiness

New Proposed CCR Standard

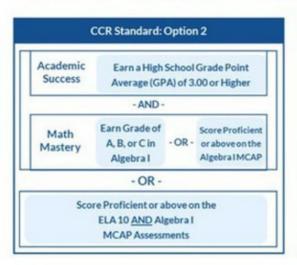
A new standard to measure College and Career Readiness (CCR) has been proposed by MSDE. The new standard included using GPA as a CCR indicator. This also included the addition of a math mastery requirement that students earn a "C" or higher in Algebra 1 or a passing score on the Algebra 1 MCAP exam.

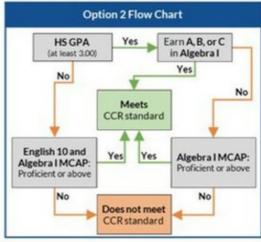
CCR Standard: Option 1 - High School GPA or MCAP Performance

Adoption Timeline

- October 24, 2023
 - MSDE staff present policy recommendations based on the research findings.

Public Input Period

- October 25, 2023 November 30, 2023
 - Online Feedback Survey Open
- November 9, 2023, 5:00 pm 8:00 pm
 - Virtual Public Hearing
- December 5, 2023, State Board of Education Meeting
 - Planned vote to adopt CCR Standard

Adopting a New CCR Standard

Proposed Implementation Timeline

As part of the new CCR Standard proposal, the revision may be implemented with this proposed timeline:

- Student Identification
 - Based on data up to and including the 2023-2024 school year, eligible 9th-12th students will be identified as meeting the new CCR Standard for the 2024-2025 school year.
- Data Collection
 - Data on students meeting the new CCR Standard will be collected in the High School Data Collection (HSDC) beginning with the 2023-2024 school year. The 2023-2024 HSDC collection will include data on graduating classes of 2024-2027.
- Funding
 - o CCR per-pupil funding amounts beginning with FY26 will be based on the new CCR Standard.
- Engagement with LEAs
 - MSDE will continue to engage Local Accountability Coordinators and others at the LEAs to provide detailed guidance and technical assistance as the policy is implemented.

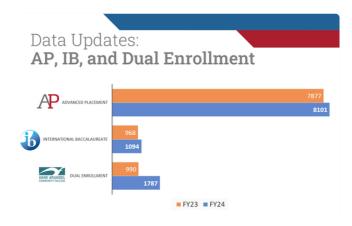

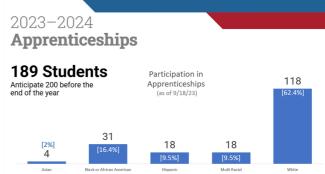
