



## 2023 AACPS Graduation Rate for Four-Year Cohort

The Class of 2023 adjusted cohort graduation rates are based on a prescribed method of tracking a given cohort of students to determine how many of them graduated within 4-years of starting high school. The following two tables show the graduation rate for four-year cohorts<sup>1</sup> comparing the Class of 2022 and Class of 2023 as published by the Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) for groups that have more than 10 students.

<sup>1</sup> The four-year adjusted cohort graduation rate is the number of students who graduate in four years with a regular high school diploma divided by the number of students who form the adjusted cohort for the graduating class. For any given cohort, students who are entering grade 9 for the first time form a cohort that is subsequently “adjusted” by adding any students who transfer into the cohort later during the next three years and subtracting any students who transfer out, immigrates to another country, or dies during that same period.
