Registration Procedures

Registration will take place online from June 26–July 3. Contact your school counselors for more information about the summer school registration process. School counselors MUST enter the summer school course information in the online registration system BEFORE parents can complete the registration process.

*Only students currently and actively enrolled in an AACPS secondary school may register for Secondary Summer School. ALL students MUST be recommended by their school counselor.

About the Program -

Secondary Summer School offers a limited number of courses for high school and middle school students, which provide students the opportunity to:

- makeup work in which they were unsuccessful.
- improve grade averages in sequential subjects.
- earn credits to meet high school graduation requirements.

All high school course offerings are for remedial credit ONLY (for high school students who have taken the course before and are repeating it in summer school).

All middle school course offerings are limited to those students who have previously taken the course(s).

Each course is highly concentrated and reviews the course content. A minimum of 12 students must be enrolled in a class to be offered. All classes will have one-hour final assessments on the last day of the summer school session.

*Secondary Summer School is a concentrated, fast-paced learning environment. Thus, learning profiles and differences should be examined carefully in the recommendation process as the goal is a successful engagement with performance outcomes.

Credit to be Awarded

- **0.50** High school students <u>repeating</u> a half year course for which they have not received credit.
- 1.00 High school students <u>repeating</u> a full year course for which they have not received credit. Students **must** have passed one marking period in each semester of a full year course to qualify for one credit in summer school.

Each student enrolling in any of the following courses for **1.0 credit** must be repeating the course and meet the following requirements:

- (a) the student was previously enrolled in the course and attended for **four marking periods**,
- (b) the student passed one marking period in each semester

Students enrolling in any of the following courses for 0.5 credit must be repeating the course and have attended the course for two marking periods.

Program Policies

Secondary Summer School is for students currently and actively enrolled in an AACPS secondary school. ALL students MUST be recommended by their school counselor.

Attendance -

Students are required to attend the entire summer school session to qualify to take final assessments and receive a grade and/or credit. Students will NOT be excused for appointments, camp attendance, vacations, etc. Students must be in class at the time at the time listed in this brochure. Repeated lateness to class will have disciplinary consequences.

NOTE: A student who is absent more than one day from Secondary Summer School, regardless of the cause of the absence, is excessively absent and may receive a failing grade and no credit for the course. Students must be present and on time for all classes each day of the Secondary Summer School session.

Code of Student Conduct & Dress Regulations

Regular school rules, regulations, and dress requirements are in effect. The sale, use, or possession of tobacco in any form by students is prohibited in all school buildings and on school grounds at all times. This prohibition includes electronic cigarettes, smoking sticks, vape pens, and/or vape liquid, whether or not they contain tobacco products. Serious and/or repeated violations of school rules and regulations will result in a request for the student's removal from summer school.

Reports to Parents

Interim reports will be issued at mid-term to students who are not succeeding at a satisfactory level. Interim reports must be signed by the parent/guardian and returned to the teacher. Report cards will be mailed home one week after the conclusion of the summer school session.

Technology Resource Use by Students

AACPS is committed to providing safe and quality instructional opportunities for all students. The student is responsible for appropriate behavior while using technology-related resources. Teachers monitor student activities while online for appropriateness and instructional relevance. Rules and regulations designed to ensure proper use of technology include but are not limited to the following:

- · plagiarize online content.
- create, access or distribute offensive, obscene, bullying, or inflammatory materials on AACPS technology-related resources or tools (including hardware, software, approved mobile devices, and websites).
- knowingly access unauthorized technology-related hardware and software to tamper with or destroy data.
- connect non-AACPS approved personal computing devices such as laptops or mobile devices to the AACPS network whether wired or wireless.
- use electronic or cloud-based resources and equipment in any other manner that would violate AACPS Board policies or state or federal laws.
- · share user account information or passwords with others.

Directed Internet Use

- Requires appropriate adult supervision. (i.e., staff members or their adult designees must be present to actively monitor student access to the Internet).
- Internet searches will be conducted using AACPS recommended search engines, online databases, and sites.
- Students may not type in web site addresses (URLS). (Exception: High School students with active supervision of an adult and in compliance with the above stated conditions).
- Internet use is permitted at all levels and in compliance with above stated conditions. For more detailed and specific information regarding school computer resources refer to the AACPS Student Handbook.

There is no tuition fee for the 2023 Secondary Summer School session.
