

Principal's Message

GATOR FAMILIES—Happy New Year to all! We're just shy of our halfway mark this school year, so it is full steam ahead for our students and teachers.

January always presents an inconsistent schedule, and this year's weather forecast may provide additional impacts. As a reminder, there is no school on January 15th for Martin Luther King Jr.'s birthday. That same week, we will have two early dismissal days, January 17-18, followed by a teacher workday (no students) on Friday, January 19th. While families often take advantage of this January schedule and take students out of school for vacations, we want to remind parents of the importance of consistent attendance. January includes the quarterly assessment window for 2nd-5th graders and the DIBELs assessment window for many of our primary students. As we monitor student attendance, we also keep in mind that the State of Maryland's accountability system within ESSA (Every Student Succeeds Act) rates schools on student attendance. Our school is penalized each time a student is absent more than 10% of the time, regardless of reason. Since the impact of poor student attendance will be felt by all, it is critical that we keep our students in school where the learning takes place. Your efforts are greatly appreciated!

As we approach the halfway point in our school year, I wanted to ensure you were aware of the many services and the plethora of information available to families in AACPS. Included in the other sections of this newsletter you will find ways to stay informed as well as ways to support your child in their learning.

SCHOOL SECURITY: DES is equipped with a video camera system. It covers selected interior and exterior public portions of the building and grounds. It is not monitored constantly, but it is monitored during emergency situations. During certain events, when the safety or security of students may be in question, authorized personnel from local, state, or federal police or fire emergency units may be given access to view images projected on the camera system.
