

Student Safety and Dismissal



Once again, our PTA will provide each family with a packet of GREEN NOTES to notify school staff about absences, late arrivals, early dismissals or changes in hów a student is getting home. We need your cooperation in establishing a con-

sistent Monday through Friday routine for how your child gets home. If your child is going home a different way than what is stated on the emergency card, a green note is the safest way to provide the school with the required written note indicating the change. It is imperative that students know their dismissal procedure each day and that changes are in writing.

The office gets inundated with calls from parents wanting to change transportation or request early dismissal at the end of the school day. It has become increasingly difficult to manage these requests, with 700 students. In addition, because dismissal is an important and busy time, we ask that families avoid picking up their child for early dismissal between 3:00-3:30.

The safety of our students is our first priority. We understand that emergencies arise, but please save these phone calls for true emergencies. <u>Th</u>ank you for helping us keep our stúdents safe. GOING HOME SICK FROM HEALTH ROOM

We would like to remind parents that when their children are sick, they need to be picked up as soon as possible from the health room at school. For those parents that work a significant distance from Four Seasons, a "back - up" plan needs to be in place so children do not spend hours in the heath room while they are ill. **Thank you, Linda Grierson, RN**

Four Seasons Elementary School is equipped with a video camera system. It covers selected interior and exterior public portions of the building and grounds. It is NOT monitored constantly, but it is monitored during emergency situations. During certain events, when the safety or security of students may be in question, authorized personnel from local, state or federal police or fire emergency units may be given access to view images projected on the camera system. If you have any questions about the system, you should call the Supervisor of School Security at 410-222-5083.

Are you planning on being a Chaperone or Volunteer this Year?

Anne Arundel County Office of School Security requires perspective Chaperones AND Volunteers to complete **BOTH** steps below:

> **Step #1**: On-line Background Investigation Step #2: Watch the Sexual Harassment and Child Abuse Video

Step #1

On-line Background Investigation

- Please note, if you have completed the background check within the past 2 years, your clearance is still good. Clearances expire 2 years from the date requested.
- To access the on-line background investigation:
 - Go to https://www.aacps.org/.
 - Click the "Families" tab.
- Scroll down and look to the left hand side under "Resources/Links." Click on "Chaperones/ Volunteers Background Investigations".
- Scroll down and hit "Apply for a Background Check."
- Complete Form.

Note: You are required to fill in both a date you wish to start volunteering and a date and location of a field trip. If you do not have an exact date or are not going on a field trip the form requires you to put in something. Put in a date that is 2-3 weeks out or an approximate date you think you will be starting to volunteer/chaperone.

Step #2 Sexual Harassment and Child Abuse Video

To watch the Sexual Harassment and Child Abuse Video:

- Go to https://www.aacps.org/.
- Click the "Families" tab.
- Look to right of screen, under the heading "Getting Involved in Your School." Click on "School and Family Partnership".
- At top of page to left, click on "School Support/ Volunteers tab."
- Look to right of screen under "New volunteers can view the: Sexual Harassment and Child Abuse Presentation (YouTube version)." Click on YouTube version link to view video.

Once you have completed the on-line background investigation and viewed the Sexual Harassment and Child Abuse Video, please sign the form your child brought home and send it in to school with your child and his/her teacher will forward it to the front office. Forms are also available in the front office.



Federal Impact Aid Survey Form

On Friday, September 29, 2017, your child will bring home a Federal Impact Aid Survey form. Please assist us by filling out the information requested on the form and returning it back to Four Seasons Elementary School.

The U.S Department of Education is now allowing a multiple child form. Therefore, AACPS has designed a form that will allow two children's names for your convenience. Should you have more than two children, please utilize a second form that you can either obtain from Four Seasons Elementary or download from the AACPS website at www.aacps.org/students. Also, please note that the complete address of the Parent/Guardian's Employer if they work on Federal Property, the complete address of the Federal Property on which they work, and each survey form must be signed and dated by the Parent/Guardian. The Federal Impact Aid Survey form for 2017-2018 will be available to download on September 29, 2017. We will also be using our Connect-Ed Automated Telephone Notification System to remind everyone about the significance of completing and returning this survey. The school system receives approximately \$2 million in funding from the Federal government in support of our children after the forms are processed.
