Signature Program

The *International Economics & Finance*

Signature will help students develop a sense of individual responsibility, learn life and career skills, gain business, finance, and economic skills, and the critical thinking skills necessary to achieve the highest levels of personal, academic, and career success. Magnet Program

Each IB high school in AACPS is home to three International Baccalaureate programs: The IB Middle Years Programme (IB MYP), the IB Diploma Programme (IB DP), and the IB Career-related Programme (IB CP). The IB is an internationally recognized program of study that leads to university recognition and a global certification for students. Schools must go through a lengthy authorization process to become and remain certified as IB schools. The four-year IB high school program offers a course of study that focuses on students developing an intercultural awareness while becoming active leaders in their local and global communities.



AVID

AVID is an academic, elective program designed to provide support to students who are in the “academic middle.” AVID prepares students to enter and be successful in college through career and college exploration.



During each AVID class, students receive instruction in: reading/writing across the curriculum, note and test-taking strategies, study skills, organization and time management.
