The Post-Master's Graduate Certificate in Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) at Mount St. Mary's University educates students on how to assess and treat behavioral, communication, developmental and learning disorders/disabilities. As a result of the interdisciplinary structure of the program, students have the unique opportunity to learn from professors with diverse experiences in ABA. Students have access to basic and translational researchers in behavioral science, as well as applied practitioners of behavioral principles who have experience in early intensive behavioral intervention, severe behavior disorders and classroom management. Graduates will be prepared to provide care in schools, clinics, homes, hospitals and everyday workplaces.

DESIGNED FOR THE WORKING ADULT

Flexibility and efficiency are the cornerstones of graduate programs at the Mount, which is designed to give you the freedom and control to balance work and school. Every aspect of the program is geared to help you earn your certificate including:

1. Course times that are designed not to interfere with traditional work hours.
2. Classes that meet only once a week during the academic year and twice a week in the summer.

COURSE SAMPLING

The Mount's Post Master's Certificate (PMC) in Applied Behavior Analysis (Graduate Certificate in ABA) is a 7 course, 21-credit certificate that aligns with the growing demand for skilled professionals in education and the health professions.

- Ethical and Professional Conduct
- Behavior Assessment
- Behavior Intervention
- Research Design, Measurement and Data Analysis
- Behavior Theory and Philosophy
- Introduction to Organizational Behavior Management & Supervision

- Electives focused on skills that will help you manage and advance your career

The PMC is designed for individuals who have a master's degree in behavior analysis, education or psychology and desire the requisite courses in a Verified Course Sequence (VCS).

TUITION, FEES AND FINANCIAL AID

Graduate level programs are designed to be taken one course at a time, providing you the flexibility you need to complete the classes at your own pace; the program pricing is set by credit hours instead of by the year like traditional undergraduate programs.

- Cost is based on 21 credits (7 courses) at \$685 per credit.

Students may also seek financial assistance through the following opportunities:

- Federal and state funded programs
- Private loan providers
- Employer tuition remission or reimbursement
- Deferral of undergraduate loans
