Creative Action









Using paper and coloring utensils, design an activism poster that advocates for people with disabilities. Include drawings and words that illustrate your cause.

The boys can play only twice a month on a sandbar when the tide is low enough. Everything changes when the teens join together to build their very own floating soccer field.</p>
		<p>Usha had lived her whole life under a gray sky and learning about the way things used to be with her grandfather. He used to spend his childhood playing in the sun until a giant wall was built to block it out. Usha and her pet dog decide to get the sun back and embark on a journey to the wall. There she tries many means to remove it, and discovers that her stories eventually succeed.</p>
		<p>This children's book tracks a package as it's lovingly prepared for shipment and taken to the post office. Recounting the steps it takes once it's weighed, stamped, and loaded aboard a truck, the story also explains what happens when the package gets lost and how it eventually reaches its destination.</p>
