

Creative Action




		<p>Liz Lightly has tried to stay out of the spotlight in high school, focusing on her plan to leave small-town Indiana to attend an elite private school on a music scholarship and become a doctor. When financial aid falls through, Liz's only shot is to compete for a scholarship offered to the prom queen. But to win, Liz will have to face her fears of being black, poor, and gay in a town of affluent whites.</p>
		<p>Carson wants to leave his mark at school by winning the Battle of the Bands, but he doesn't actually have a band. And his brother was shot in a racist crime. Maggi and her family, back in the Rez after seven years, work at selling beadwork to tourists, though she would prefer to make high-concept art. Carson is attracted to Maggi, until he finds out she is in a relationship with a white man who doesn't treat her as well as he should.</p>
		<p>An autobiography of twenty-one-year-old Shane Burcaw, a young man with spinal muscular atrophy. Shane humorously chronicles the daily challenges he faces living with this life-threatening disease, while offering an overall uplifting take on life.</p>
