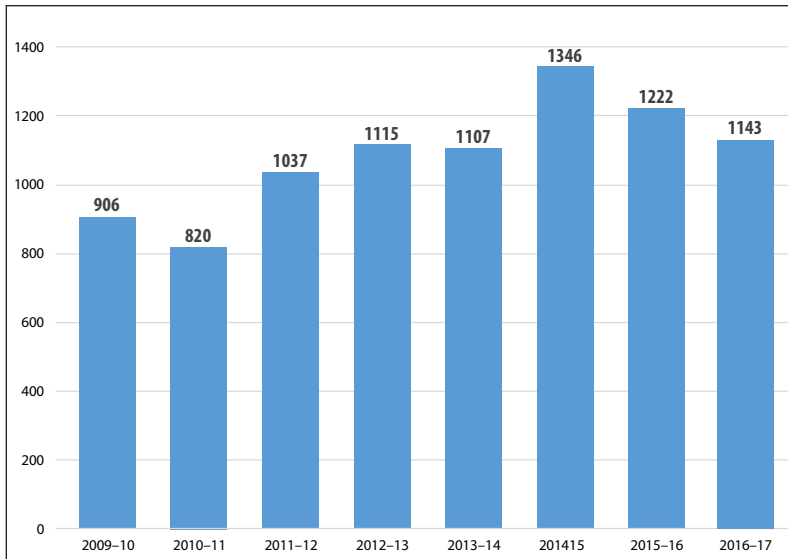


End of Year Homeless Metrics | 2016–2017

Who is a homeless student?

A child who lacks a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence. The child may live in a shelter, motel, car, campground, or on the street. Homeless children may be “doubled-up” with relatives or friends due to a loss of housing, natural disaster, or economic hardship.

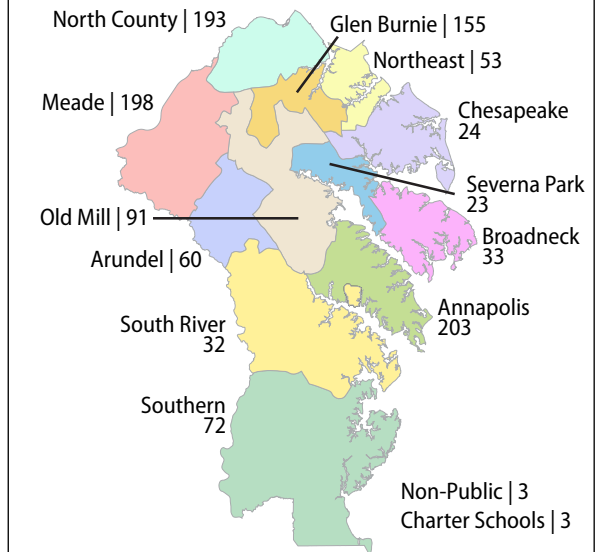
How many homeless students do we have (by grade level)?

Unaccompanied Youth <i>A youth not in the physical custody of a parent or guardian. Also includes youth who are residing with a caregiver who does not have legal guardianship and youth who are living on their own.</i>	269
Doubled Up <i>A family residing with relatives or friends after losing stable housing.</i>	941
