<sup>1</sup> Enrollment in a dual credit course will only be approved by the *Director of Curriculum and Instruction* for the AACPS high school English graduation requirement if a student has extenuating circumstances, such as:

- Approved plan to graduate from high school early
- Documented medical issue requiring schedule adjustment(s)
- Other extreme hardship (evaluated on a case-by-case basis)
