

PVA High School Music Auditions

Brass and Woodwinds



General Information

- All students interested in PVA must complete an online application at aacps.org/magnet
- All students interested in PVA must sign up for an audition appointment. This can be done within the online application.
- You will be required to complete four tasks as part of the audition:
 - Scale performance:
 - A one octave chromatic scale starting either on concert F or concert Bb (flute and clarinet will perform two octaves).
 - A one octave major scale chosen from the keys of **concert** E flat, A flat, or F major (flute and clarinet will perform two octaves).
 - Scales must be memorized.
 - The prepared selection as posted on the PVA website (www.aacps.org/pva)
 - Melodic sight-reading
 - Rhythmic sight-reading
- An interview of three questions is required and scored along with the performance portion of the audition.
- A warm-up area will be provided and you should arrive early enough to warm-up so that you will be ready for your performance.
- Students must come prepared with their instrument, mouthpiece, reeds, etc.
- All students expressing an interest in the PVA Magnet Program are highly encouraged to audition, regardless of whether or not they have had formal or informal training.

Possible Ways to Prepare for the Audition

- Attend a PVA Information Night to hear more about the program and audition process and see the PVA schools.
- Attend a PVA Audition Prep Night where you can get feedback on your audition preparation from PVA staff, ask questions about the prompts, and hear more about the audition process.
- Speak to a music teacher at your school about your prepared piece, scales and sight-reading preparation.

Scoring Criteria

You will be scored on the following criteria for each task:

- **Prepared selection (as published at www.aacps.org/pva):**
 - Melodic and rhythmic accuracy
 - Tempo
 - Intonation
 - Tone (beauty, blend, control)
 - Technique (articulation, embouchure, facility)
 - Interpretation (expression, phrasing, style)
- **Scales:**
 - Memorization
 - Accuracy
 - Tone
 - Tempo/pulse
- **Melodic sight-reading:**
 - Note accuracy
 - Intonation
 - Rhythmic accuracy
 - Tempo/pulse
 - Tone (beauty, blend, control)
- **Rhythmic sight-reading (may clap hands or tap on lap):**
 - Rhythmic accuracy
 - Tempo/pulse

Brass and woodwind applicants must score at least an average score of 7 on their audition (including on-site audition and interview) to be eligible for this program.
